
For God's Greater Glory: Gems of Jesuit Spirituality



But if they do not comprehensively represent Jesuit spirituality, they are among what we would call its 'gems' because of their deep contemplative orientation.

About the editor Jean-Pierre Lafouge

Jean-Pierre Lafouge is Associate Professor of French at Marquette University. Born in 1944 in Champagne, France, he later studied philosophy at Nancy and taught philosophy in several lycées in France and in Morocco (1962-1976). His academic career took him to the United States where he obtained a Ph.D. in French literature, specializing in nineteenth and seventeen century French and Orientalist Literature. He is the author of several articles dealing with the relationship between art, Orientalism, philosophy, and literature. Jean-Pierre Lafouge has also published a book on Eugène Fromentin and is presently assisting in the revision of French to English translations of the writings of Frithjof Schuon.

Raymond Gawronski, S.J. specializes in dogmatic theology with a focus on mystical eschatology and is an Associate Professor at Marquette University.
