
Master of Zen: Extraordinary Teachings from Hui Neng's Altar Sutra

One day in the 7th century A.D., an illiterate woodcutter named Hui Neng (638-713) walked into a Chinese marketplace. He heard someone reciting The Diamond Sutra, and was instantly enlightened. Tze-si "Jesse" Huang was born in Chungking, China, the youngest of ten children. At a young age, Jesse stowed away on a freighter going to Hong Kong and Taiwan, where he stayed and prayed with the monks at various temples. With little formal education he was able to pass the university entrance exams in Taipei, and eventually immigrated to the US, attending New York University and Columbia University for postgraduate studies. In 1975, he met his wife, the children's book author and illustrator, Demi. In the United States he worked as a financial analyst and manager in several US companies, and became the Executive Director of the Hudson Health Systems Agency in New Jersey, all the time supporting his family in China.

Demi is the award-winning author of over 130 bestselling children's books. Her titles have sold over half a million copies. *The Empty Pot* was selected by former First Lady Barbara Bush in 1990 as one of the books to be read on the ABC Radio Network Program *Mrs. Bush's Story Time*, sponsored by the Children's Literacy Initiative. Demi's book *Gandhi* was named a *New York Times* Best Illustrated Book and received an Oppenheim Toy Portfolio Platinum Award. In addition, she represented the United States at the First International Children's Book Conference in Beijing, China, in 1992. She lives with her husband in Yarrow Point, WA.
